Debby is probably the sister of Sado Ganges (GPIDS0720) . In the record

of his visit to Samuel Painter's family in 1806, Robert Sutcliffe reports that Sado's sister was captured along with him and that she " was placed in a situation near S. P.'s, [Samuel Painter's] which afforded them frequent opportunities of seeing each other." The records point to Debby. She was about the right age to be Sado's sister; she was on the Phoebe (like Sado); and William Seale's farm in Birmingham was about a mile south of Samuel Painter's farm in East Bradford, both on the east side of the Brandywine. No other female indentured into Chester County comes as close.
